

DOCOMOMO US/New York Tri-State Preserving the Recent Past 4 Grant

Full Application Instructions

Eligibility

The scholarship is open to current undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students enrolled in established institutions of higher learning, as well as emerging professionals who have graduated within the past five years. Applicants actively engaged in issues concerning the documentation and conservation of buildings, sites, and neighborhoods of the Modern Movement may be given preference. "Documentation" may be in the form of research or scholarship, such as thesis or class projects, related to architecture, design, or planning topics associated with the 20th-century Modern Movement.

Applicants are asked to demonstrate their committed interest in the fields of history, architectural preservation, architecture, landscape architecture or related disciplines and how attendance at the symposium will meaningfully advance their goals or work.

Preference will be given to applicants studying, working or residing in New York, New Jersey, or Connecticut, or currently or previously engaged on topics related to the New York Tri-State region's Modern Movement.

Reporting Requirements

Within 30 days of the symposium, the grant recipients are required to submit a brief article (500 words) on their experience at the symposium. The article will be published on the Docomomo US/Tri-State website.

Application Requirements

Email submissions as an attachment (Word or PDF) to info@docomomo-nytri.org with the subject line "Symposium Grant Application." Include:

- 1. Statement (up to 250 words) that explains how this grant will meaningfully advance your goals, scholarship or work. Please discuss:
 - a. Your research interests in the Modern Movement and how your research or professional work will contribute to the scholarship or body of knowledge on Modernist architecture and design.
 - b. What you hope to learn and accomplish by attending the Docomomo US National Symposium.
- 2. Curriculum vitae. (2 pages maximum)

Deadlines

To be considered for the grant, please submit your application by Sunday, January 19, 2025, 11:59 pm

Applicants will be accepted and notified on a rolling basis. We encourage early application. All grant recipients will be notified in early March 2025.

Within 30 days of the symposium, grant recipients are required to submit:

- 1. A brief article on their experience at the symposium. (500 words)
- 2. Receipts for expenses to be reimbursed as outlined in the grant award.
